

Sorting Guide



Food waste

Please tie your bag with a knot.

Food residues and bad food. Peels, egg shells, apple cores. Fish and chicken bones. Coffee filters and tea bags of paper. Cut flowers.



Plastics

Empty and scrape out packaging.

Rigid and flexible plastics. Plastic packaging from detergents, shampoo, food, with or without labels. Non-deposit plastic bottles. Film and candy bags.



Food and beverage cartons

Empty and fold packaging.

Cartons from milk, cream, juice. Carton packages from chickpeas, tomatoes, yoghurt, and similar.



Paper

You may leave in staples and tape.

Clean and dry paper, such as magazines, newspaper, weeklies, envelopes – window and non-window. Receipts and drawing paper.



Glass

Empty and scrape out the container.

Wine bottles and other non-deposit glass bottles. Preserve jars and broken drinking glasses. Pill and sports jars.



Metal

Empty and scrape out packaging.

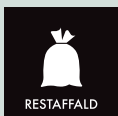
Preserve cans, bottle caps, metal lids. Pots, pans, cutlery. Capsules from tea light candles. Aluminum foil, foil trays, non-deposit cans.



Cardboard

You may leave in staples and tape.

Cardboard, such as corrugated cardboard and carton. Cardboard packages from food, toothpaste, detergent. Pizza boxes, rolls from tissue and toilet paper.



Residual waste

Only what you cannot sort in other waste types.

Napkins and tissue paper. Sanitary waste, kitchen sponges and polystyrene. Vacuum cleaner bags and cigarette butts. Animal bedding, ash and sweepings.



Hazardous waste

Look for the hazard labels on the product.

Chemicals, paints, pesticides. Energy saving bulbs, fluorescent tubes, printer cartridges. Aerosols such as deodorants.



Textile waste

Put textile waste in a clear bag and tie a knot.

End-of-life clothing and textiles, such as clothes, towels, and bedlinen. They may be holey, worn, stained, or otherwise damaged, but they must be dry.



Small electronic items

Everything with a wire, solar cell or battery.

Phones, tablets, gaming consoles, and chargers. Electronic toys, lamps, cables, wires etc.



Large electronic appliances

We only collect large electric appliances that can be picked up by two people without assistive devices.

Domestic appliances, washing machine, refrigerator, TVs, computer screens etc.



Garden waste

Please keep bundles of garden waste under 120 cm in length and 50 cm in diameter.

Hedge trimmings, weeds, grass, flower waste, leaves that have fallen on grass and or soil in gardens.



Bulky waste

Place bulky waste by fraction, upright and unstacked.

- **Discarded furniture and wood for recycling**
Furniture, large toys, garden tools, garden furniture, logs and tree stumps, wooden furniture, boards and planks.
- **Large iron and metal items**
Drying racks, ironing boards, bicycles, prams, etc.
- **PVC**
Cable tubes, garden hoses, paddling toys, wellies, etc.
- **Impregnated wood**
Outdoor wooden materials, wooden banks.



Reuse and swapping

Drop off for swapping or reuse where you live, in second-hand stores, containers in the public space, or at the recycling centre. Read more about how to sort out your waste for recycling on: frederiksberg.dk/affal
